




# AGRICULTURE IS CALLING




Photo: Farmers and specialists exchanging insight in a biodynamic study session

## **BIODYNAMIC AGRICULTURE**

Organic, regenerative, sustainable, ecological, and biodiverse farming methods all have one thing in common: they are more or less focused on soil biology. The terms healthy soil, healthy plants, healthy animals and healthy food for human beings come out of this context.

In every aspect of a **biodynamic farm**, the human being is the starting point. We extend scientific research methods towards the driving forces that work beyond the physical, without drifting into mystical esotericism. This requires a comprehensive understanding of the whole human configuration. We are not only physical beings. We are enlivened and ensouled AND we are conscious of it. We are aware of who we are.



A well-diversified farm in its origin is a mirror of the whole human being. In 1924 Dr. Rudolf Steiner gave eight lectures to farmers; these are the foundation of Biodynamic Agriculture. The content in its width and depth, and the application of the biodynamic preparations, can be understood ONLY out of a profound understanding of Anthroposophy.

The intense study of Steiner's Agriculture Lectures, in combination with other material, will be the foundation of this **Biodynamic Farming Diploma Program.** 



# WHAT YOU WILL LEARN, WILL MAKE YOU GROW











RSCC is proud to offer a comprehensive Biodynamic Farming Diploma Program.

This two-year, distance-learning course is approved as a vocational diploma program under the Ontario Career Colleges Act, 2005. Our comprehensive curriculum covers every aspect of biodynamic agriculture. It will give each student deep insights into the inner workings of a biodynamic farm organism.

To gain hands-on experience during the time of study and to improve practical skills, all students are required to do practicums on accredited biodynamic farms.

Upon successful completion of all program requirements students will receive the Biodynamic Farming Diploma.

## This qualification prepares learners to:

- start and operate a biodynamic farm
- work at any biodynamic enterprise worldwide
- take a position as farm manager, head gardener or livestock manager
- work in post-harvest roles such as biodynamic food processing
- work in biodynamic and organic certification services
- work in food advocacy and environmental protection agencies.

The Biodynamic Farming Diploma Program is open to participants in North America and worldwide who would like to deepen their knowledge of biodynamic agriculture.



#### A CURRICULUM FOR FARMERS BY FARMERS











The curriculum for the RSCC Biodynamic Farming Diploma Program covers every aspect of a working biodynamic farm.

The first year focuses on the farm as an organism and individuality.

This includes an understanding of the development of the human being through ancient time epochs, the principle of the ancient village with "centre and surroundings" starting in the 6th century, the three-and four-folding of the human being and its relation to a farm, and the intrinsic role of livestock on biodynamic farms.

The second year focuses on the three pillars of soil fertility:

- Soil cultivation in connection with the cycle of the year
- Crop rotation, cover cropping, seed saving, etc.
- Fertilizing.

The Biodynamic preparations are perhaps the biggest riddle in agriculture. The preparations are a living technology based on the highest spiritual insights. They can only be understood from a profound understanding of spiritual science.

Recognizing that substances change depending on their origin, and that they are carriers of forces, is crucial to understanding the nature and significance of biodynamic preparations. Farmers today need to understand thoroughly how to make and apply the preparations. They must be able to rationally explain the process in full detail.

Anthroposophical foundations are studied thoroughly and systematically during the two-year course. The resulting insights will pave the way for understanding the Agriculture Lectures by Rudolf Steiner, delivered in Koberwitz in 1924.



# THEORY WITHOUT PRACTICE IS EMPTY... AND PRACTICE WITHOUT THEORY IS BLIND

While the online Zoom lectures can teach a wide spectrum of theoretical knowledge, the practical know-how will be learned on biodynamic farms. Each student will need to complete four 2-week practicums during their two-year journey through the program.

This guarantees that all participants can gain essential practical experience corresponding to the subjects of the curriculum.

The practicums can be completed at Bear River Farms in Nova Scotia, or at any other biodynamic farm that can showcase the required activities and is approved by RSCC.

#### Summer Practicum

- Daily farm chores, feeding, milking, barn cleaning, pasture management
- Making of the stinging nettle & valerian preparation
- Hay making
- Grain harvest and post-harvest activities
- Product marketing (Farmers Market, CSA, Whole Sales, etc.)

#### Fall Practicum

- Daily farm chores, feeding, milking, barn cleaning, pasture management
- Setting up a compost pile and applying the compost preparations
- Making of the horn manure preparation
- Burying of the yarrow, chamomille, oak bark and dandelion preparation
- Field cultivation and seeding of winter crops
- Application of the horn manure and horn silica preparation

#### Winter Practicum

- Daily farm chores, feeding, milking, barn cleaning
- Preparing the barn manure with compost preparations
- Hay-flower and leaf-hay making
- Added value (cheese making, butchering, baking, milling flour, etc.)
- Create a detailed written "farm-profile" that showcases all details of the farm

#### **Spring Practicum**

- Daily farm chores, feeding, milking, barn cleaning, pasture management
- Repair and construction of new fences
- Unearthing the preparations
- Making of the yarrow, chamomile, dandelion and horn silica preparation
- Digging of a soil profile for soil analysis
- Applying horn manure and horn silica on fields and gardens



You must be at least 18 years old and have a Secondary School Diploma or equivalent. You must have physical strength and stamina appropriate for farm work during the practicums. You must have access to an internet connection with sufficient bandwidth for video conferencing.
